<p><b>William Perry Sponsor</b>            In 1853, William Perry purchased the home for his wife and 10 children. <p><b>Isaiah Brown Sponsor</b>            Isaiah Brown remodeled the house into a 'Saltbox' in 1740, adding a blacksmith shop.
